





From your Interim Priest-in-Charge

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ forming as disciples and apostles at St. James',

How blessed and grateful I am to introduce myself to you as your new Interim Priest-in-Charge. As an interim, my priority will be helping you frame and shape your next steps in God's Mission in Danbury and beyond. For the next year or so, I will be your guide-by-the-side, raising up *your* gifts and collaborating with *all* of you to continue the good work God has already begun within *each* of you. What an exciting time to be together!

Building new relationships, strengthening existing ones, all the while responding to God's movement in our lives is, to me, a wonderfully breath-taking experience. I imagine, at this very moment, we *all* are taking deep collective breaths, perhaps still waiting for this thing we are calling a New Missional Age (yes, the Church you and I grew up in has changed!) to reveal its meaning for us. We have been called together for a reason and a purpose. I am already marveling at this gift of time together that we have been offered.

What might you want to know about me? I have been an ordained parish priest for 19 years, and Rector for the past 14 years. I live in a Church Rectory in Bridgeport, with my clergy spouse, Geoffrey (Rector of St. John's— a parish very similar to St. James'). We also own our own home up Rt. 7 in Kent. (I anticipate that I will do more of my commuting to Danbury from there – a shorter and much more relaxing drive!) I am very engaged in ECCT Region and Diocesan activities, *for the purpose* of being a keen student of the changes we face as The Church in the 21st century. I value sharing the collaborative gifts we have within and among our parishes to be the ever-stronger Episcopal presence in our communities.

I am a second-career priest, having transitioned from a vocation in public education to the ordained ministry. Life-long learning and formation is the common thread for me. I trust that God through Christ is *always* up to something, and *always* for our benefit. With that said, I can be described as light-hearted, being compassionate toward our very human foibles and seeking forward movement in Jesus' spiritual teachings, reminding myself and others, when needed, that God is not yet finished with us. At the same time, I take ongoing faith formation seriously, understanding that relationships are fragile, our time on this earth is limited, and we have been given this moment as a gift to live fully.



As a cradle Episcopalian, I fell in love with our liturgy at age seven. I may not have understood the theological intricacies of what was said and done, and yet the sense that worship changes me into something greater than myself continues to fill my heart to this day. I took the opportunity to worship with you as a visitor on Oct. 7. I wanted to know what worship “felt like” in the pews. What a gift to experience excellent liturgy, great music, and a sense of collective presence!

I have a missional understanding of outreach. Doing *with* others, rather than *for* others requires deep listening to the heart-beat of our community, seeking to be in relationship with our neighbors. My deep gladness is often found in the face of The Others in our midst. I have lived globally since age 11, when my father’s career took us to live in Paris France. At that formative age, I found myself surrounded by an international community. I discovered, then, that the realities of my limited world view were not necessarily shared by everyone else. I began to enlarge my perspective by learning how others experience this crazy thing called Life. To this day, I remain deeply awed and moved by the diversity of life into which we were created. Seek the face of Christ – the image of God – in each person placed in our path, and a joyful reunion of souls is bound to happen. Ministry happens out of that encounter.

What might I want to know about you? Everything! Your prayers, hopes and dreams. Your naming of ways in which your life together takes you more deeply into God’s life-giving, liberating, love. And your concerns about places in need of strength, as you ready yourselves to seek and find a new Rector.

May we find blessings in our encounters and fruits in our labors,



News about our student, **Maria de Jesus Roque** October 16, 2018



In January 2017, the parish of St. James' Episcopal Church in Danbury, CT entered into a God-centered, love-filled relationship with a child in Honduras named Maria de Jesus Roque. Over the last two years, many of our parishioners, as well as our extended circles of family and friends, have joined hands and hearts to share our time, talents and treasures with this child. We sponsor Maria spiritually and financially. We pray for Maria every Sunday in our **Prayers of the People** and we keep her close to our hearts by attending church events in her honor. Financially, we support Maria by contributing \$5400 each year to her food,

clothing, education, medical care, dental care and housing. We have a generous parish, reflecting the generosity of our savior, teacher and friend, Jesus.

Our student Maria is currently 9 years old, living and going to school in Tegulcigalpa, Honduras at El Hogar: *The Home of Love and Hope*. Maria will celebrate her 10th birthday on January 1, 2019. With God's blessing and help, our special birthday gift to her will be a third year of sponsorship.

Candy Beckwith is the Donations Coordinator for El Hogar. She oversees the day-to-day facilitation of the Child Sponsorship program from their headquarters in Woburn, MA. Candy is a great resource to us, serving as a liaison between our parish and our student, Maria. She reached out to the school in Honduras to

ask about Maria. Candy reports, “Maria is finishing up fourth grade. She’s doing well in her classes and works hard to finish her work and do her best. She likes to read, and spends time in the library during her free time. She can also be found playing with the cat whenever she has a spare moment. On the outside she seems tough, but she is quite caring and sweet in quieter moments. She was recently seen comforting one of the younger kids who was upset. She’s enjoying practicing table tennis with her sister Heydi.”

Candy was able to get us a sneak-peak at Maria’s report card. Once school ends in November, official report cards will be sent in English for the sponsors. Though many of us don’t speak Spanish, we can see that Maria does indeed

Our goal is for them to fulfill their ultimate potential as productive, caring and independent Honduran citizens.”

The bedrock of our support for Maria comes from our family of regular donors who quietly and humbly include El Hogar in their yearly giving to St. James'. Another pillar of our financial strength comes from our talented bakers and crafts people who donate their time, talent and treasures at our **December Cookie Walk and Craft Fair**. And THANK YOU shoppers! Our talented musicians, Joanne Archibald, Nick Kuell and Alexis Willoughby, offered a fundraising concert in June 2018 called **Bach to Broadway**, which helped us reach our goal for 2018. September 2018, we crowned Jim Beschle the first **Wings Over Maria** champion. This fundraiser offered great fellowship, finger licking good wings and a healthy sum toward our **2019** commitment! The beautiful trophy fashioned by Allan Brown is a testament to the way in which our parish expresses love for God and for each other and for Maria. Finally, the **Paint and Sips** organized by Linda Spaziani and Karen Hess, owner of Color on Wheels, have allowed us to meet in community, celebrate this child, think beautiful thoughts and create beautiful art.

This is one parish working under God to support one child.

Thinking ahead, what is our hope and dream for this ministry? Are we prepared to support this child for another year in her life? Shall we invite a speaker to give us a first-hand update on life at El Hogar? Should we consider organizing a service team to Honduras?

As of this writing, October 16, 2018, we have approximately \$1000 ready for January 1, 2019, a great head start into the New Year. However, now that we are in transition toward calling a new rector, we may not have the time and energy to host many fundraisers. Please consider joining the family of quiet, humble donors. We are sharing God's love as we **pray, hope and dream** for Maria. If God calls you to give in this way, make out your gift check to St. James', with El Hogar in the memo.

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION

Church School- Godly Play

This year is the second year of our Godly Play curriculum, and the children are really enjoying their lessons. This fall, we began with our lesson on The Circle of the Church Year, which talked about the Church Calendar and why it is a circle. The children all thought it was really neat that different colors represent different components of the year. We then covered other Bible stories from the Old Testament such as Creation, The Flood and the Ark, The Great Family (about Abraham and Sarah), The Exodus, and The Ten Best Ways. In December, we will begin our Advent lessons and the children will understand that it takes 4 weeks to "get ready" for the birth of Jesus.

The children are really enjoying their second year of Godly Play and as always I enjoy their questions and observations during our time in class. They have also been enjoying some new art materials this year during their "work time" or art creation time after the lesson which has included gel pens, Play-Doh, scented markers, and glitter markers. We also have a "feast" each week at the end of class where we talk about what we are thankful for each week.

Pageant rehearsals will be on Sundays at 11:15-12:00pm in the sanctuary on November 11, 18, 25, December 9 and December 16.




