Dear Brothers and Sisters of Saint James',

As your Wardens we wanted to communicate to you what has been done thus far as a Parish in Transition and what you can expect in the short term. First, let us again thank Joseph for his pastoral leadership over the past nine years and wish him and Jim the best of luck in the future.

We have been fortunate at Saint James' that in the past 37 years we have had only 3 Rectors, Michael and Ann Coburn, Our Bishop Laura Ahrens and Joseph. So while a time of transition can be unsettling there is no reason to doubt that the result of our transition will be like all the others resulting in a Rector who will leads us for many years to come.

The Diocese anticipates that a transition will take somewhere from 12 to 18 months from the date Joseph departs. Your Vestry has already accomplished some tasks that will allow the transition to start ASAP. We have submitted our financials to the diocese and we have been allowed to recruit a full time Rector. Secondly, we have arranged for "supply priests" to Celebrate Sunday services. The Reverend Peter Powell will celebrate on September 2 and The Reverend Iris Peterson will celebrate for the remainder of September and into October as necessary. During that time the Canon for Mission Leadership will be recruiting an Interim Rector. The vestry has asked if Rev. Iris Peterson could be a candidate for Interim Priest and/or Rector and we were told that because of her past relationship to Saint James' she is not eligible to be a candidate for either position.

It is also diocesan policy that we should not be in contact with Joseph on social media after he leaves, including Facebook, Twitter or Instagram.

Your Vestry has met with the Canon for Mission Leadership, The Reverend Lee Ann Tolzmann, who was reassuring and quite detailed in her explanation of the Transition Process. The Reverend Tolzmann, who will coordinate the transition process, will be at Saint James' on Sunday October 7, to explain the process for the entire congregation.

During the interim and until an Interim Rector is chosen the Wardens are designated to handle the day to day operations of the parish in consultation with the Vestry. Please see one of us with any concerns or issues, please do not go directly to Iris, Carolyn or any of the staff so that there can be consistency. Also, the Capital Campaign which had been scheduled for 2019 will be postponed.

There are many concerns, as is natural, but we would like to reassure the parish that your vestry is very engaged and determined to make this process as quick, thorough and productive as possible. Past history shows that we have always been blessed with a great spiritual leader(s). Let us all pray that the Holy Spirit will guide us during the Transition and Bless us with a Rector that will serve God's work for the benefit of Saint James' and beyond.

FROM THE RECTOR'S OFFICE

FINAL WORDS

My dear Parishioners:

By the time you read this, that salutation will no longer be true. You will no longer be my parishioners and I will no longer be your priest. Knowing how very hard it is going to be to say good bye, and not wanting to totally "lose it" AGAIN (as I did on 8/12 sending off a couple of our college students at the 10 AM Service), I wanted to give just a few words of thanks to you all.



As a priest, it was always an honor to say, "I am the Rector of St. James', yeah, the church with the red doors and beautiful garden." It has been a privilege to know that I enter into the long history of this place, even in a small way. It was an honor to lead a place that so looks to be a part of God's mission in Danbury and the world. Over the years I have tried to be as visible as possible in the community so that people would know that St. James' is alive and well. That was sometimes at the cost of pastoral ministry you may have wanted, and I am sorry if I did not meet that need. I'm not sure if any priest can "do it all."

It was hard for a few of you to accept a priest who was married to a person of the same gender. Some could not, though not many at all. You took a risk and I thank you for that. I have no doubt that you prayed for discernment and acceptance as hard as I did. And, through the work of the Holy Spirit, for the most part, we were able to fall in love with each other. I know that once you saw that I could love you, and be a pastor to you, everything else became irrelevant. Thank you for giving me the chance to love you and for returning that love which I will carry with me into my future.

Jim and I celebrated our first wedding anniversary here at St. James' (though we had been together 8 years before we could legally marry). One of the memories that I will hold in my heart forever is singing, "Be thou my vision" at the Parish Picnic with tears of joy streaming down my face since we sang that at our wedding. My heart burst with pride seeing a cake wishing us a happy first anniversary. At no point did I ever feel that I had to hide who I was from anyone nor "tip toe" around the phrase "my husband." I always knew that if the "haters were gonna hate," you all had my back. Of course, when you're married to a great guy like Jim Hughes, it makes it that much easier. While these phrases have only become popular in the past few years, you did live "If it's not about love it's not about God" and "love is love is love."

One of the hardest parts of being a loving priest is when it is time to leave. So as not to interfere with the relationship with the new priest, it is necessary for the former Rector to avoid contact as much as possible with the old Parish. While I would dearly love to continue to baptize your babies, perform your marriages, or do your loved one's burial, I cannot. That must fall in the arms of your new priest with whom you need to form the same bond as you had with me.

Change that we don't necessarily want is always hard. But I do want you to know that I will miss you, even as my life slows down in (semi) retirement. I pray for the future of St. James' and I ask that you continue to hold me in your prayers. Jim and I look forward to the next chapter in our life but know you will always be a part of my book of life.


Dear Friends:

As of June 30, 2018, ARC has finished another fiscal year. It's been a very active year because the needs in our area are growing. Over 93% of the people we serve live on small incomes, at or below poverty thresholds. Approximately 5% of the people we serve are single adults (ages 21 to 65 plus) and 95% are adults with babies, children, and/or youth. In one way or another, 100% of the people served are broken. Because of your generosity, ARC provided services for 8,702 people in our community and have been a part of their healing

Vestry Meeting

August 21, 2018

7pm



In attendance: Joseph Krasinski, Linda Spaziani, Jeanne Todaro, Rob Mondello, Lyn Meyers, Karen Montecalvo, Janet Brown, Susie Sarksian, Carolyn Flynn

Absent: Victoria Woody, Bill Ostrand, Beth Cox

Meeting called to order at 7pm.

I. Opened with an oral tradition bible study based on 1 Corinthians 3: verses 5-9. All participated.

II. Vestry Clerk resignation. Discussed resignation . Susie volunteered to take minutes Pro Tem for this meeting. Until a short term replacement is found, vestry members will take turns helping out.

III. Red Doors Wide Open update.

- Pray/Hope/Dream board has been a great success. Once it's wiped clean, seems to fill back up very quickly.
- Greeters- noted that there were none at church this past Sunday. Have been other Sundays where there were no healing prayer ministers, or chalice bearers, etc. Reminder to send any changes to Dilsa prior to printing of bulletin. This will be especially important in upcoming months when we have guest priests

IV. June vestry minutes. Karen motioned to approve. Second by Janet. Minutes approved as submitted.

V. Financials. Reviewed financials, which are typically discussed in July- but due to no vestry in July, they were reviewed at this meeting. Carolyn motioned to approve. Rob seconded.

VI. Vestry spending amount. Discussion took place about decreasing the amount allowed to be spent without vestry approval. Has been a limit of \$5K up until now, and three different bills of almost 5K have accumulated for buildings and grounds and repairs. All agreed to lower the limit to 2K. Rob motioned to approve. Lyn seconded.

VII. Approval /Explanation of invoices. Recent invoices for B&G. 1st repair was to flashing separated from the building, sealed the flat part of the room. 2nd repair was to

the area behind the Ascension window where water was leaking down. 3rd repair was to chimney with cement over the brick. Cement was starting to crumble.

VIII. Executive Session

IX. Legal Fees. A discussion took place around legal fees. For June/July, it's up to \$2639.50. Janet motioned to pay the bill. Seconded by Carolyn

X. Rector's retirement. Discussion took place around the logistics of Joseph's upcoming retirement. All committees have been asked to help contribute to coffee hour send off this Sunday. The rectory will have some regular upkeep that will need to be maintained once the house is vacated: 2 humidifiers in the basement to empty regularly, lawn to mow (Ricky) weekly walkthroughs. Noted that house is due for interior painting. Discussion around the utilities and house maintenance. Reminder that all should 'unfriend' Joseph and Jim on social media in order to comply with Safe Church protocol. (On that note, it was suggested we post the wifi password, and post Safe Church guidelines).


Father Joseph requested to take his laptop with him. It's 5 years old at this point. He must delete all files related to St. James and anything that would be considered proprietary property. Karen motioned to let him take the laptop. Lyn seconded. Also noted that his name must be removed from the alarm company call list. Will need to get different names listed- wardens?

XI. Old Business. Daily Bread renovations. Rob presented plans for proposal which include DB putting in their own electric meter. This will be an interior renovation only. Nothing is final at this point, is in proposal stages only. The grant is only good until May 2019. Of concern is that they must be connected to our grease trap. Our grease trap is producing a bad smell when the closet opens in the kitchen. Rob suggested we approach the installer to correct the issue.

XII. New Business. Encumbrance of Grounds. Things such as the sexton living on the grounds, or Daily Bread building will have to be approved by the Standing Committee in the near future.

All Committee. Talked about having All Committee on the 1st Tuesday of both September and October (except Stewardship), during transitional time while waiting for Interim. Agreed to have All Committee on Sept 4, and October 2. All vestry are responsible for communicating to their respective committees. By-laws- will need to be redone at Annual Parish meeting. Question on whether or not we need a list of the 'voting members' of the congregation. Reminder that we will need to bring in a new clerk and 3 new vestry members.


